

How to get there...

Allow yourself 2 - 3 hours driving time.

Leave Cape Town on the N2, and head up Sir Lowry's pass. After coming down HouwHoek pass, exit left onto the R43 to Hermanus. Drive through Hermanus and continue for approx 30 kms to the **Stanford** turnoff. Turn right into the town. Proceed on the main street (Queen Victoria St.) Just beyond a dip in the road, drive past the graveyard and turn left into Moore Street. At the stop street & junction at the end of Moore, look for a Wortelgat signpost.

The Campsite is now 10 kms ahead of you on this road, so note your mileage.

The road becomes gravel, passing through fields and tall bushes. Ignore Farm turnoffs along the way. At approx. 10 kms you will go through the second cattle gate. About two to three hundred metres after the gate you will see on the right hand side a small cottage and the camp gates. Approx 50 metres inside the gate the road forks LEFT. Stop at Reception for directions to the Cottages

Stuff to take...

- Your own food (see menu on right)

- Plate, bowl, mug, knife, fork & spoon
- Tea towel
- Your Bible and a Torch
- Backpack, beach shoes, sunhat and sun-screen, waterproof jacket (in case)
- One extra litre of milk
- One extra portion of meat for Sunday's Potjie
- As per our tradition, each family is asked to bring a cake (to be cut and shared at teatimes)
- *Optional - Hot water Flask for the hike*

Sat	8am	Breakfast bring your cereal, bread, fruit, jam etc.
	9am	Hike begins
	1pm	Lunch on the beach. Bring sandwiches, fruit & juice
	7pm	Braai Bring meat, rolls & salad to share
Sun.	8am	Breakfast as per Saturday
	10 am	Morning Service
	1 pm	Potjiekos bring meat and veggies for the cook-up
	3pm	Home. Pack up & clean up
